

Watch for wolverines



**WOLVERINES ARE RARE AND LIVE IN THE AREA.
THEY ARE SENSITIVE TO HUMAN DISTURBANCE.**

- !** Be aware – reduce noise and tune eyes and ears for wildlife.
- 🐾** Watch for tracks which are usually solitary and far ranging.
- i** Watch for dens which are holes in the snow with lots of tracks in and out.

IF YOU SEE TRACKS

Please take photos and a GPS location.

IF YOU SEE A CONCENTRATION OF TRACKS

This could be a den or food cache.

Do not approach.

Take photos and leave the area.



Tracks usually follow a 2x2 or 3x3 pattern.

Tracks are 8-10cm wide and 10-12cm long with 5 toes.



If you come across an animal, STOP. Don't approach!
